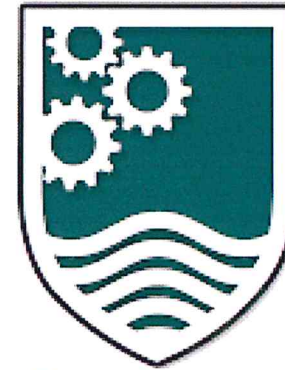
P.E day: Both classes have P.E. on Thursday afternoons.

Autumn 2 - The Saddlers

Numeracy

This half-term children are multiplying and dividing 3 and 4 digit numbers by single and double-digit numbers. The unit begins by finding and defining multiples, factors, common factors, prime numbers and composite numbers. After this, they work with square and cube numbers before moving on to multiplying by 10, 100 and 1000. Pupils then move on to multiply by 2-digit numbers before beginning to divide by 10, 100 and 1000.

The children will also be solving word problems that involve multiple steps and a variety of operations. Pupils begin the unit by simply choosing the correct operation before moving onto representing the key information using bar models.

R.E

This unit is called 'Is the Christmas story true?' The children will be explore whether sacred text has to be true to help people understand their religion.

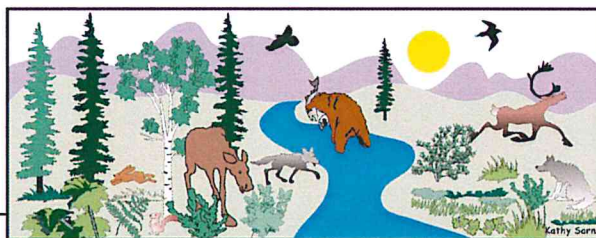
Science

This unit is called Living Things and their Habitats. They will learn about the reproduction and life cycles of plants, mammals, amphibians, insects and birds. We will also learn about Jane Goodall and her work to save chimpanzees in Africa.

Literacy

In this unit, the children explore the Big Question: Which animal makes the toughest migration? They will read the interactive eBook, using the skills of skimming and scanning to find answers to questions and using the organisational features of the eBook to find information. In their writing task, children will plan and write a chronological report about a specific animal migration.

In this unit, the children will explore narrative poems, focusing in depth on the work of two poets. They will watch and enjoy a poet reading his work. They will write the 'back story' to a poem in narrative form and compose an autobiographical narrative poem.



DT

Children will design, make and evaluate a case for a mobile phone following their own design criteria.

ICT

The children will use software to produce an animation linked to their curriculum work.

SEAL

This unit is called *Getting on and Falling out*. The children will learn about friendship and how to deal with confrontation and strategies that they could use to resolve them.

P.E

This half term children will be taught by a specialist P.E coach. This will develop their dance and gymnastic skills.

Music

Children will continue to follow the 'Rock It' music lessons taught by the specialist music teacher.

French

This unit children will learn family names and describe the clothes they wear. They will go on to identify French animal names and how to describe them.
