

## **Sports Premium Funding**

### **Review of spending for the 2017-18 Academic Year**

Our allocation of sports premium for 2017-18 was £9,710

#### **Purpose of the funding:**

Schools must spend their additional funding on improving the provision of PE and sport. How this improvement is achieved is at the discretion of the Headteacher/governors

### **Use of Funding at Bloxwich Academy 2017-18**

- Specialist teacher to run after school dance clubs for children.
- Enable the school to run after school clubs in football across age-groups.
- Setting up house system to promote competitive sports.
- Increasing opportunities for pupils to take part in sporting competitions.
- Enabling the school to take part in local league competitions particularly in football.
- Purchase of specialised resources and equipment to enhance provision in PE lessons, activities and lunchtime.
- Teacher with responsibility for improving the quality of PE provision in the school.

### **Impact of Sports Premium Funding 2017-18**

- Increased pupil engagement in sports activities.
- Pupils demonstrate greater self-esteem and self-confidence.
- Lower rate of pupils missing out on PE lessons through disengagement.
- Improved quality of PE provision through support with skills progression.
- Planning shows evidence of greater focus on developing key skills.
- Positive attitudes to health and exercise – greater uptake of sports related extra-curricular activities.
- Pupils engaging in sports activities through choice during lunchtimes.

### **Bloxwich Academy Sports Premium Report 2018-19**

The projected sports premium funding for 2018-19 is £19,600

At Bloxwich Academy we want to ensure that every child has equal access to a wide range of sporting activities, both competitive and non-competitive, and that physical activity is sufficiently promoted to ensure that levels of participation are maximized in all areas of the school. Furthermore, the school wishes to ensure that children's engagement is long lasting and that participation continues beyond the immediate vicinity of the school.

Possible uses of funding might include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or coaches to work with primary teachers.
- Supporting the least active children in school with specialist programmes.
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE.
- Providing cover to release teachers for professional development.
- Running sport competitions or increasing participation in the school games.
- Buying quality assured materials or modules for PE and sport.
- Providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs.
- Pooling the additional funding with that of other schools.

### **Proposed use of funding for 2018-19**

- To update our PE resources and the storage of these to ensure that the teachers and children have access to the very best equipment that is available.
- To develop links with other providers i.e. Wilenhall and secondary site.
- To develop further links with local secondary schools to improve the quality of PE provision, use of facilities and also access quality CPD for staff.
- To provide resources to help teach PE and sport more effectively; specifically, to increase provision of extra-curricular activities in the form of netball clubs, increased dance clubs, rounders and basketball.
- To provide children with increased access to competition both in school through the house events and also externally with sports fixtures.
- To continue to provide opportunities for Year 3-6 pupils to access swimming at the secondary site.
- To access PE teaching expertise from the secondary site to improve the quality of PE teaching.
- Purchase of PE kits to support low income families and children persistently failing to bring kit.
- Support the running of a residential involving access to outdoor adventure activities.
- Purchase of equipment to support lunchtime and playtime activities.
- To support children with places in holiday play schemes.
