Uniform	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Will uniform stay unchanged? Current uniform items as detailed were as cheap as possible and the current policy is clear.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Uniform is staying the same. The aim is for uniform to be as cheap and accessible as possible and there are no logos required on uniform throughout the Trust. Sometimes parents felt the non-logo items were poor quality but this was not generally the case. Logos can also cause some children to feel left out or different.• There will be a consistent approach to ensuring the uniform policy is enforced from the very start of the next academic year.
Reading Culture	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Would a reward system help to improve reading? Are there other ways of engaging children who don't like reading? Can reading at home be monitored and linked to rewards?	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Targets could be set individually for the year group or the level of reading for a particular pupil and a reward scheme then implemented. The mobile library has been a successful way of engaging children therefore this will be expanded upon. Visits from authors of various genre are also in the pipeline. The new BoomReader app is being rolled out in September which will be an online reading record.
SEND	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• What additional support can the school give to SEND children?	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Bespoke SEND training on a half termly basis is given to teachers, which is linked to the needs of pupils in School. SEND CPD for all staff is also delivered regularly. Themed assemblies are planned to share experiences of SEND and there are plans for a therapy dog in school. Allotment and Forest School activities are also available to help meet therapeutic needs.
