

Childcare

Curriculum Intent: Childcare provides pupils with the skills and knowledge that enables them to make a valuable contribution to society, and to progress in the workplace. It provides pupils with interesting key information that will be required to function effectively in their own day to day life and to support in the lives of others.

Curriculum Rationale: We ensure our Childcare curriculum enables pupils to not only gain knowledge in development and factors that affect development but also the soft skills/interpersonal skills needed to be successful in the workplace. At level 3 a balanced curriculum focussing on both childcare is provided in line with students' future job aspirations.

What makes the Bloxwich experience unique: You will study 3 unique and different components covering a broad range of knowledge and skills to enable you to progress onto a level 3 course. You will have the opportunity to develop both your study skills as well as participating in practical activities. At level 3 students will be given the opportunity to complete 50 hours of work experience in a childcare setting.
