What is the Sports Premium?

Since April 2013, all primary schools have received government funding to improve **Physical Education (PE), school sport and physical activity**.

The aim is to secure long-lasting improvements so that all pupils lead **healthy, active lifestyles** and benefit from high-quality PE.

Funding is based on:

- £16,000 lump sum
- +£10 per pupil

For 2024–25, Bloxwich Academy Primary received £19,490.

We use this funding to:

- Increase participation so all pupils are active every day
- Improve the quality of PE lessons and competitive school sport
- Enhance staff skills and confidence through CPD and coaching
- Provide broader experiences, especially for disadvantaged and less active pupils
- Ensure PE is inclusive and accessible for SEND pupils
