

## **Bloxwich Academy Primary – Sports Premium Statement 2024–2025**

### **What is the Sports Premium?**

Since April 2013, all primary schools have received government funding to improve **Physical Education (PE), school sport and physical activity**.

The aim is to secure long-lasting improvements so that all pupils lead **healthy, active lifestyles** and benefit from high-quality PE.

Funding is based on:

- **£16,000 lump sum**
- **+ £10 per pupil**

For 2024–25, **Bloxwich Academy Primary received £19,490**.

We use this funding to:

- Increase participation so all pupils are active every day
- Improve the quality of PE lessons and competitive school sport
- Enhance staff skills and confidence through CPD and coaching
- Provide broader experiences, especially for disadvantaged and less active pupils
- Ensure PE is inclusive and accessible for SEND pupils

### **Impact of Our Sports Premium 2024–25**

#### **◆ Improved Quality of PE Teaching**

- Specialist coaches delivered high-quality sessions
- Teachers received CPD through co-teaching and modelling
- Improved progression, planning and consistency across PE

#### **◆ Increased Participation in Competitive Sport**

Teams entered:

**Football, Netball, Athletics, Cricket, Rounders, Tag Rugby, Cross Country**

SEND pupils and girls' participation increased.

Swimming provision improved for all pupils.

#### **◆ Broader Sports Experiences**

Children accessed:

- Boxing sessions
- Orienteering
- Multi-skills
- Dance and gymnastics
- Lunchtime sports zones
- Wide range of after-school clubs
- ◆ **Support for Less Active Pupils**
  - Targeted clubs for children who struggle with physical activity
  - Lunchtime zones promoting daily active play
  - Adapted equipment to ensure inclusion
- ◆ **SEND Sporting Opportunities**
  - Participation in local SEND-inclusive competitions
  - Adapted sports equipment purchased
  - Staff trained to deliver inclusive PE
- ◆ **Leadership Development**
  - Year 5/6 Play Leaders trained to run lunchtime games
  - Increased confidence, communication and teamwork among pupils
- ◆ **Swimming Boosters**
  - Additional sessions funded for pupils not meeting NC expectations
  - Improved water confidence and competence
- ◆ **Talent Academy Club**
  - Designed to nurture potential sporting talent
  - Pupils took part in kickboxing, street dance and specialist sessions
  - Encouraged resilience, confidence and motivation

**1 Continue improving quality of PE teaching**

- PE specialist CPD
- Co-teaching for sustainability

**2 Strengthen competitive sport participation**

- More competitions entered
- Focus on girls & SEND representation

**3 Broaden enrichment & after-school provision**

- More clubs and specialist visiting sports

**4 Drive inclusion & accessibility**

- Adapted resources for SEND
- Targeted intervention for less-active pupils

**5 Improve equipment & facilities**

- Replace worn items
- Invest in wider range of sports resources

**6 Reduce barriers for families**

- Continue subsidising transport
- Keep clubs free or low-cost
