How the Funding Was Used:

- 1. Employing Qualified Sports Coaches
 - Employed specialist sports coaches (Progressive Sports) to work alongside teachers.
 - Delivered high-quality PE lessons and led extra-curricular clubs.
 - Provided co-teaching and mentoring, building teacher confidence and improving the overall standard of PE delivery across the school.

2. Supporting Less Active Pupils

- Introduced targeted lunchtime and after-school activity clubs to support children who are less physically active.
- Offered a range of activities such as multi-skills, dance, netball, athletics, cricket, rounders and other inclusive activities.
- Used adapted equipment and structured lunchtime sports zones to promote daily active play and engagement.

3. Staff Professional Development (CPD)

- Funded staff attendance at local PE networks (via the Streetly Academy PE Network subscription).
- Provided PE-specific training and Enrich training to strengthen subject knowledge and pedagogy.
- CPD supported staff to deliver a broad, inclusive and high-quality PE curriculum.

4. Enhancing Extra-Curricular Sport and Competitions

- Expanded participation in local sports competitions and School Games events, including:
 - o Football, Netball, Athletics, Cricket, Rounders, Tag Rugby, Cross Country
- Subsidised transport and equipment so that all pupils could take part, regardless of background.
- Raised the school's profile in inter-school competitions and community sport events.

5. Purchasing Equipment, Uniform & Resources

- Purchased new PE equipment to support both curriculum delivery and extracurricular activities.
- Improved playground and lunchtime resources encouraging active play.
- Provided PE and representative sports kit to ensure all pupils can participate with pride and without financial barrier.
- Improved storage to keep resources safe, accessible and organised.

6. Swimming Booster Sessions

- Funded additional swimming lessons for pupils who had not yet met national curriculum requirements (e.g. 25m, safe self-rescue).
- Increased pupils' water confidence and swimming competency across targeted cohorts.

7. Challenge and Support for SEND Pupils

- Attended local inclusive events designed specifically for pupils with SEND.
- Purchased adapted sports equipment to support pupils with physical, sensory or coordination needs.
- Provided staff training on inclusive PE, ensuring SEND pupils could access the full offer.

8. Talent Academy Club

- Established a Talent Academy Club to identify and nurture sporting talent.
- Provided opportunities to deepen skills through high-quality, enriching activities, including:
 - Kickboxing
 - Street dance
 - Specialist coached sessions
- Supported pupils to step outside their comfort zones, build confidence and explore routes to local clubs and development pathways.

Impact of Our Sports Premium 2024–25

Improved Quality of PE Teaching

- Specialist coaches delivered high-quality PE across the school.
- Teachers gained confidence and skills through co-teaching and modelling.
- There is now improved progression, planning and consistency in PE lessons.
- Staff report greater confidence in delivering inclusive, engaging PE.

Increased Participation in Competitive Sport

- More pupils participated in inter-school competitions across a range of sports.
- Representation of girls and SEND pupils in sports teams increased.
- Swimming provision improved for all pupils, with more meeting or moving towards meeting NC expectations.
- The school's profile in local sport and community events has strengthened.

Broader Sports Experiences

Children accessed a wider variety of sporting opportunities, including:

- Boxing sessions
- Orienteering
- Multi-skills festivals
- Dance and gymnastics
- Lunchtime sports zones
- A wide range of after-school clubs

These experiences helped children discover new interests, develop confidence and enjoy being active.

Support for Less Active and Vulnerable Pupils

- Targeted clubs and lunchtime zones successfully engaged children who were less active or reluctant to participate.
- Adapted equipment and structured games ensured that all abilities could join in.
- For SEND pupils, participation in inclusive competitions and adapted PE led to improved confidence, social skills and enjoyment.

Leadership Development

- Year 5/6 pupils trained as Play Leaders, running games and activities at lunchtimes.
- Play Leaders developed communication, teamwork and leadership skills, while also increasing activity levels for younger pupils.

Whole-School Impact

- Increased pupil participation in clubs and competitions, especially among traditionally less active groups.
- Improved teacher confidence in delivering high-quality, inclusive PE lessons.
- Stronger engagement in physical activity throughout the school day.

- Pupils demonstrate improved teamwork, resilience, confidence and enjoyment of physical activity.
