Year 2 led a fantastic Harvest Festival assembly for the school and their parents on Friday 4th October 2019.


Through words and song, the children explained the importance of Harvest perfectly. We would like to thank parents for their attendance and generous donations.





ONLINE SAFETY UPDATES


West Midlands Police has been made aware of an App called "UNICO LIVE". The app is publicised as age-restricted 12+ and designed for young people to upload videos of them performing, singing and dancing etc. It has come to our attention that there is inappropriate content on the platform involving young people which is being investigated.

The content does not appear to be monitored and we urge you to raise awareness widely to increase vigilance and reduce the likelihood of any child being sexually exploited. Please discuss at the earliest opportunity with your family.

Helping parents keep their children safe online.

We've designed a simple checklist to give you peace of mind regarding your child's safety on the internet.

Set your children's device up before you give it to them so you know they're safe online as soon as they start playing.



Get started



Set parental controls on your broadband to prevent your children seeing things they shouldn't



For smart phones check parental controls are also set up on the mobile network

Set up the device safely



Use the device setting age appropriate apps and games



Set up password control or disable in-app purchasing so big bills are not run up accidentally



Disable location services so your child doesn't unintentionally share their location with others

Thank you to all parents/carers, who attended our Autumn term parents' evening, and engaged in our esafety questionnaire.



This week, Year 4 have been learning about **Ancient Greece**.

They have had the opportunity to take part in their **very own** Olympic games.

Everyone was very competitive and put in 100%. Our games were a little more modern compated to the Olympics in Ancient Greece.







This week Year 5 have had lots of fun on their residential trip to the Farm!

They have enjoyed lots of fun activities with their favourite being catching and weighing the Pigs with the Farmers.

They have also been on long muddy walks, baked some home-made treats and fed the animals.

They even had a special birthday whilst at the farm!





This week, Year 3 have continued their learning about light and dark. They have learnt about which materials are opaque, transparent and translucent by carrying out a test. The children carried out an investigation whether a shadow becomes bigger or smaller depending on the distance the object is away from the light source.

In maths, the children have been focussing on their 4 times tables looking at division and multiplication. Children have found this less challenging due to them accessing Timestable Rockstars from home.
