

Mental Health Awareness Week

TRIP TO PARIS!



During Mental Health Awareness Week, the Academy discussed body image concerns. This is an increasing concern in teenagers today, and can be a risk factor for mental health problems. Research has found that higher body dissatisfaction is associated with a poorer quality of life, psychological distress and the risk of unhealthy eating behaviours and disorders.

School Council organized different activities, during the week, to raise funds for a local mental health charity. They sold green ribbons, which had the Bloxwich Academy logo printed on them. Money was raised from a raffle of a teddy bear and pupils were invited to buy cakes as well as a cup of tea, with cake, in the Success Centre where they could talk to friends or a member of staff. Various staff supported the pupils including our school counsellor. Both staff and pupils asked if it could be done again due to its huge success.

Additionally, pupils participated in activities during form time and PSHE. Whole school assemblies were held and pupils discussed their thoughts and feelings regarding body issues and the affect upon our lives and well-being. At the end of the week, £100 was raised. More importantly, pupils felt more aware of the issues of body images and know where to go to get advice in the Academy.

On Friday 28th June, 86 pupils in, Key stages 3, 4 and 5, departed early from school for a four-day trip to Paris, France. We stayed at the Château de Grande Romaine near Paris. Upon our arrival, everyone enjoyed a buffet style French dinner before being taken on a tour of the grounds.

The next day, we all enjoyed a typical French breakfast before setting off to Disneyland Paris for a fun day. We were brave enough to go on the big thrill rides such as the Rock 'n' Roller Coaster, Space Mountain Mission 2, the Tower of Terror, and Big Thunder Mountain. There were tears of laughter whilst others cried with fear!

On Sunday morning, we visited the Eiffel Tower. Followed by a sightseeing tour of Paris, on an open deck bus, we visited Montmartre and the Sacré-Coeur Basilica. We strolled along the Place du Tertre, where artists such as Picasso, Van Gogh, Modigliani and many more have all drawn inspiration from what has become known as "The Artists' Square". The old town square of Montmartre welcomes thousands of tourists every day; many of us had our portrait painted. During the visit, we learned that the word 'bistro' was invented at the square's oldest restaurant in 1814 during the Russian occupation after the Battle of Paris.

At the end of a busy day in central Paris, we returned to the Château for our evening meal and tasted snails. We also enjoyed a game of rounders on the grounds of the Chateau before making "crêpes" (French pancakes).
