

Pupils had the opportunity to take part in a mixed media textiles workshop with professional textiles artist Jennifer Collier at her studio, Unit Twelve, in Stafford. The aim of the visit was to support research work for the GCSE and A Level Textile Design exam. Pupils were also able to experience how professional textile artists work in studios and see how the work is produced. The studio also had a new exhibition, which was based on a range of different creative disciplines which gave pupils inspiration for the exam and future projects.

The day consisted of pupils developing experimental techniques in the morning session. Then all of the samples produced were collated together and made into a personal sketchbook by each pupil.

In the afternoon pupils had the chance to make a garment in the style of the artist. All of the work produced by pupils has been used as development work for the exam preparation.

As we left the studio Jennifer praised our pupils and said that they were a very pleasant group of girls to work with. Further to that, in an email Jennifer, said: "The pupils of Bloxwich Academy were an utter pleasure to work with in the workshop at my galley, Unit Twelve. They created stunning work and were open to trying new ideas and experimenting with different techniques. They all had very clear ideas of what they wanted to make, which led to many beautiful and varied garments being created. The pupils thrived in seeing working artists' studios and gallery space, and were very inspired in their work by everything they saw and experienced."

After the visit, pupils were asked to comment about the experience that they had on the trip. The feedback was very positive from pupils and we are already discussing the next visit.

A big well done must go to all of the pupils that attended the visit and they were a credit to the school. They worked really hard and left the studio with a wide range of samples to assist with their exam preparation.

"This visit to the Unit Twelve Gallery to meet Jennifer Collier was really beneficial to me. Not only did we get to experience Jennifer's workshop we were able to see the work of other textile artists. We gained some information on how she started her career and how she has progressed to this point.

Within the workshop, we made multiple samples using techniques that she had demonstrated to us such as waxing and trapping vintage items. This helped me to realise how versatile different objects could be and that I could use these techniques in my future work.

During the workshop, I had a discussion with Jennifer to ask for any advice on how to start a career within the textiles industry. She helped me by explaining her story of her career, such as starting by completing a degree in Textile Design at University. This helped me to finalise the career path that I will choose because I could see myself working in the textiles industry.'



As well as dressing up, there were also lots of exciting activities taking place across the Academy including: guess the title quizzes, World Book Day themed lessons and World Book Day photo booths.







Social Sciences News

Overall, the day was fantastic. We raised over £300, which deserves a huge thank you to everyone who helped and supported the day's events.






Geography News




